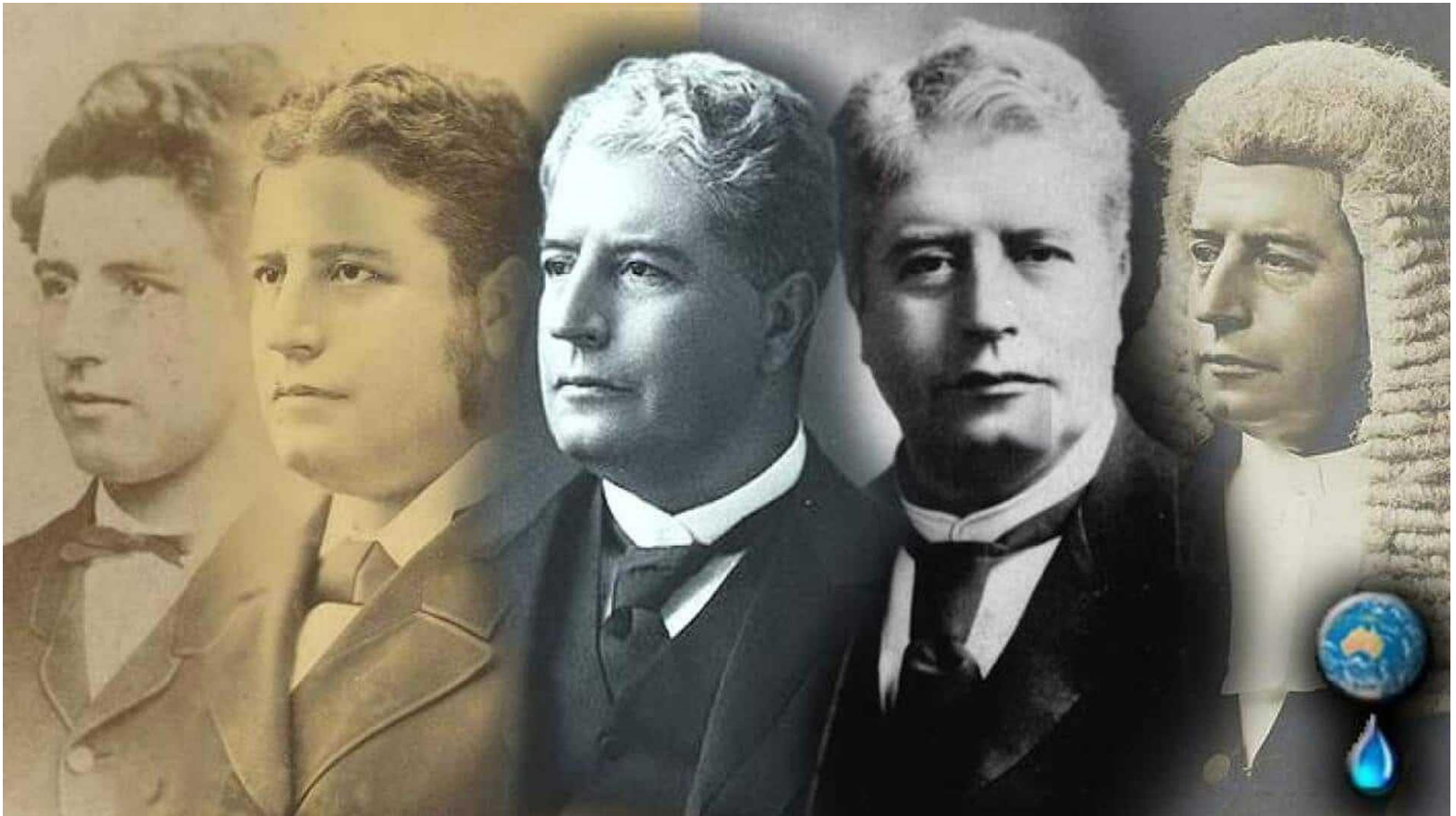


Image Analysis: Notice & Wonder

The first Prime Minister of Australia was Sir Edmund Barton. He served as Prime Minister from January 1, 1901, to September 24, 1903. He was appointed by the Governor-General, Lord Hopetoun, and not elected by the party with the most support in the House of Representatives. Sir Edmund Barton was a very important person in the federation movement, which was the movement to bring all the Australian colonies together to form one nation. He was one of the leaders and founding fathers of the federation movement and played a key role in drafting the Constitution of Australia. After resigning as Prime Minister, he became one of the first judges of the High Court of Australia.

Sir Edmund Barton was born on January 18, 1849, in Sydney, New South Wales. He was a very smart person and went to the University of Sydney. He studied classics and graduated with a Bachelor's degree in 1868. He was also a barrister, which means he was a lawyer who could argue cases in court. Sir Edmund Barton was a strong supporter of the federation of the Australian colonies. He believed that all the colonies should come together to form one nation. He worked hard to make this happen and played a big role in writing the constitution for the new nation.

Even though Sir Edmund Barton was the first Prime Minister of Australia, he did not serve for a very long time. He resigned in 1903 and became a judge on the High Court of Australia. He served as a judge until his death on January 7, 1920. Sir Edmund Barton was a very important person in Australian history because he helped bring all the colonies together to form one nation and he served as the first Prime Minister.
